Are you storing your prescription medications correctly? Storing prescription opioids safely is key when it comes to keeping them out of other people's hands.

1

LOCK THEM UP

Store prescription medicines in a safe place only you know about. (Not the medicine cabinet) Lock them up if you can.

2

NO LOOSE PILLS

Prescription opioids should only be kept in the bottle provided by your pharmacy.

3

SECURE AFTER USE

After taking your prescribed dose, immediately return the bottle to a locked cabinet or safe place.

4

TRACK QUANTITIES

Always know how many pills should remain in the bottle. This will help to know if any have been taken by someone else.

5

SAFELY DISPOSE

Make sure to dispose of old or unused prescriptions properly.

6

PAY ATTENTION

Social distancing means spending more time at home. Make sure you're locking up your opioids safely.
